Remembering Dr. Arthur M. Branco

Dr. Branco was a highly respected member of the Northwest Indiana medical community. Dr. Branco enjoyed life with his wife Marilyn, his seven children and his 11 grandchildren.

His gentle demeanor, ready smile and champion ping-pong skills will be missed by many, but his legacy lives on in the Catherine McCauley Clinic in Hammond, Indiana, a volunteer-based clinic for uninsured patients, on whose founding board he served and where he devoted

years of patient care and leadership, along with his thriving medical practice.

WANT TO REDUCE YOUR INDIANA STATE TAX BILL?

THIS IS A WIN-WIN FOR YOU AS AN INDIANA TAX PAYER AND FOR PLANTING POSSIBILITIES.

Planting Possibilities participates in the Indiana Housing and Community Development Authority's Neighborhood Assistance Program (NAP). Every donation of \$100 or more (maximum limit of \$3,000) made between July 1 and December 31, 2021, is eligible for a 50% Indiana State tax credit. Planting Possibilities realizes the entire amount of your donation! If you

donate \$100, you receive \$50 tax credit; a donation of \$500 receives \$250, \$1000 donation realizes a \$500 credit. Those tax credits are directly subtracted from your Indiana state taxes on your tax form.

Planting Possibilities is limited to \$5,151 in tax credits to "sell"; however, we only have \$1,163 left for 2021. We sell out of credits every year; therefore, we must offer these

credits on a first-come, first-serve basis. Any business or individual that pays Indiana State income tax is eligible, and \$300/\$600 of your donation qualifies for a federal tax deduction through the federal CARES Act.


