Breaking Ground at Our New Garden Space at Crossroads YMCA

In our last newsletter, we announced our upcoming prevocational training program. This new program, which will be based at Crossroad YMCA's Camp Triangle Hills in Crown Point, will benefit persons with autism and other developmental disabilities who need to develop some general job skills before they can be successfully employed in a community setting.

Those general skills will be taught through a horticulture program. The skills attained through this program will be the important "soft skills" that will make our students valuable employees across Lake County. Punctuality, appropriate job-place behavior and hygiene, respect for one's supervisor and co-workers, teamwork, and other desirable qualities will be reinforced while participating in a horticultural-based setting.

We have learned through our past five years of providing job coaching services that quite often it is not a job-seeker's ability to perform the assigned job tasks, but the ability to conduct themselves in a work-place appropriate manner that will make or break a successful attempt at employment. Through our horticulture program, we will reinforce desirable work habits so that our students will experience success in their chosen future jobs.

In October, we put our first mark on our new space by defining the area for our new



garden space at the Y camp. In November, Mike McCormick, one of our wonderful volunteers, tilled up the garden plot to start preparing it for the spring planting. Thanks, Mike! We will start with an approximate 10,000 square foot garden area with raised beds, traditional garden beds, trellis gardening, and examples of gardening for small spaces where our visitors and YMCA camper participants can get ideas about how they might fit garden spaces in their own yards. OUR CAMPAGNA GARDEN

We had a relatively small garden this year. But it was the perfect amount of food for the culinary staff at Campagna to create dishes using our produce, such as eggplant parmesan and pasta sauce, and add a little bit of spice to their cooking by including our pepper varieties. We tried a few new things this year at the request of the students. We planted Collard greens, Swiss chard, sweet



potatoes and luffa gourds, along with the usual tomatoes, peppers and sweet corn. Our grape vines are producing purple and green grapes.

Over the winter, we will learn how to transform the inside of the luffa gourds into luffa sponges. We are learning new things every year!
